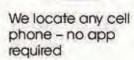

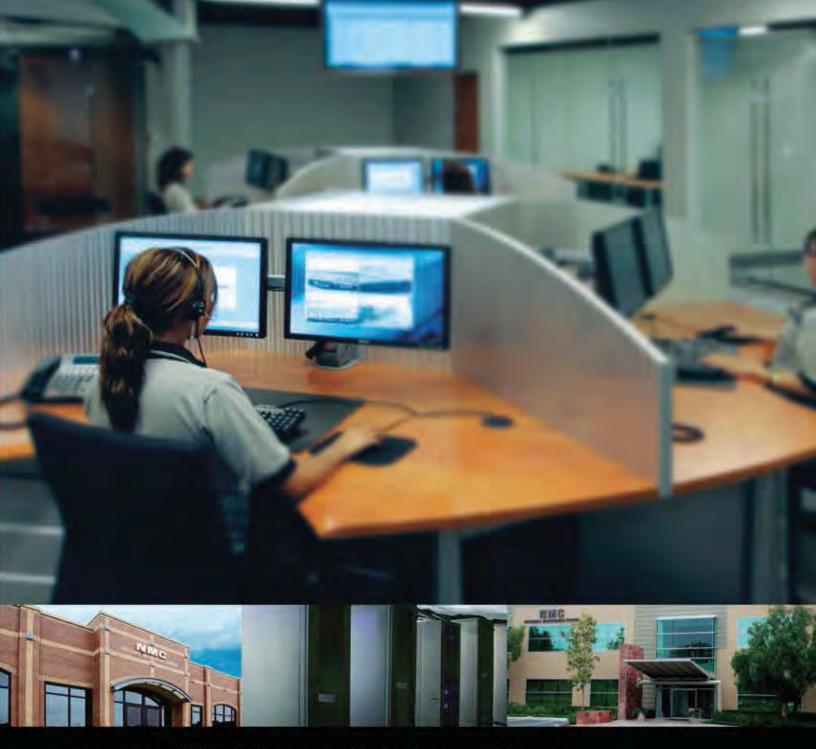

Which is Better...Blind or Video?

If you sat a bunch of preschoolers around the table and asked, "Which is better...blind or video?" They all know the answer. If your follow-up was, "Which is better...pay more or pay less?" They still know the answer. In the same way, the rule book for a financially successful alarm business is not complicated.

A better product at the same cost beats the competition, even in the RMR business. Video verified alarms just hit this milestone – faster police at the same cost as a blind alarm. The business of selling, installing, and monitoring burglar alarms just got better because video (and video monitoring) now costs the same as going "blind." Dealers can sell greater security and increase their RMR without increasing their costs. Which is better? Ask your customers, "Which is better...faster police or slower police?" Video verified alarms are better at the same price.

As costs for video cameras have come down they are found everywhere, from cell phones to car bumpers. Now they are on PIR motion detectors. The latest wireless camera/PIRs, called Motion-Viewers, send alarm videos to the central station for immediate review and dispatch. Motion-Viewers cost the same, are installed the same, and work the same as the wireless PIRs dealers have used for years – but they have also contain a battery powered color video camera. These aren't CCTV cameras with power cords and signal cables needing bandwidth, network connections and static IP addresses that increase cost and installation time of the classic burglar alarm.

Alarm installers went "wireless" to minimize installation costs (and make more money) and the wireless MotionViewers fit this same business model; they make more money. But unit price and installation costs are only part of the financial model, what about monitoring? Higher monitoring costs kept video alarms as a niche product and have been a major barrier to video verification moving into the "mainstream" alarm business. That recently changed.

Leading central stations now monitor indoor video verified alarms using MotionViewers for the same cost as a traditional blind system. Indoor MotionViewers are efficient and cost effective in the central station, in part because they don't depend upon the varied flavors and complexities of DVRs and CCTV cameras. The PIR trips, the video clip is sent as part of the alarm – simple and clean. A better product at the same price means a competitive edge and video verified alarms deliver faster police response – an eyewitness is better than a blind alarm signal.

Video verification is not just for new installs, there is a simple upgrade path for the installed base. Progressive central stations are providing training sessions and webinars to educate installers on easy video upgrades for existing alarms. In fact, Telular just announced an upgrade kit that combines the Telular cell communicator and a video verification into a single package for existing alarm systems. This means that installers can use video verification to "sweeten the pot" as they work to move their customers away from POTS lines.

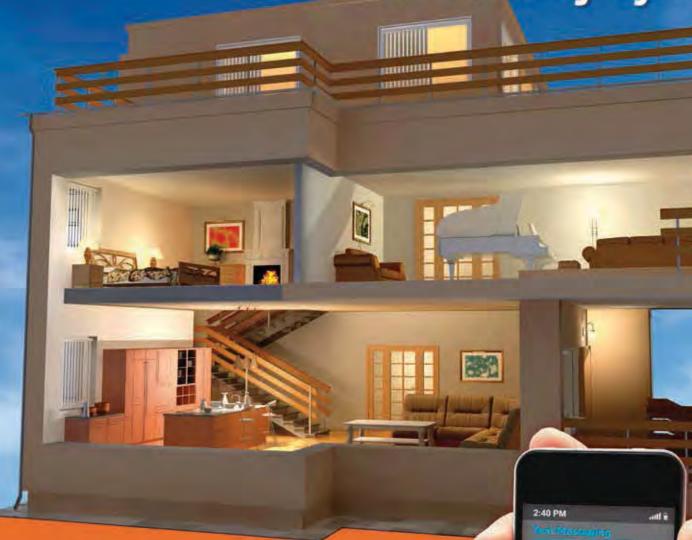
The marketing focus group really becomes as simple as asking a table full of preschoolers, "Which is better...video alarms or blind alarms?" Your customers know the answer.

IACP Comes Out in Support of Alarm Licensing

At the recent annual IACP (International Association of Chiefs of Police) meeting in Philadelphia, the general membership endorsed a resolution on licensing requirements for companies and individuals in the alarm business. The resolution was proposed through the IACP – Private Sector Liaison Committee where SIAC's Stan Martin chairs the Alarm Sub-Group.

Mandatory licensing with criminal background checks for key alarm company employees was considered a public safety issue by IACP. It also ensures higher quality employees and installations. Importantly, the IACP, in its resolution, sends a strong message to state legislative bodies that it is a critical public safety issue which needs attention in states that do not have alarm licensing laws and/or criminal background checks.

SIAC believes this is another important step forward in this public/private partnership, having the IACP standing behind a measure that helps winnow out bad actors. It's good for law enforcement, the alarm industry and the citizens we serve.

SIAC salutes IACP for this resolution, and looks forward to positive results in the years to come.

Year End Considerations – Reasonable Compensation

Most companies in our industry are S Corporations for Federal Tax Purposes. This is a good decision on the part of the shareholders as it typically minimizes tax consequences, especially if the company sells assets.

While an S Corporation generally pays no tax on its net income, its shareholder employees are usually taxed on the net income of the corporation. Shareholder employees should be aware of the Internal Revenue Service's position on reasonable compensation. The IRS Code (Sections 3111 and 3301) states that employers must pay employment taxes on wages paid to their employees. The IRS further define officers of a corporation "who perform more than minor services for a corporation", as employees.

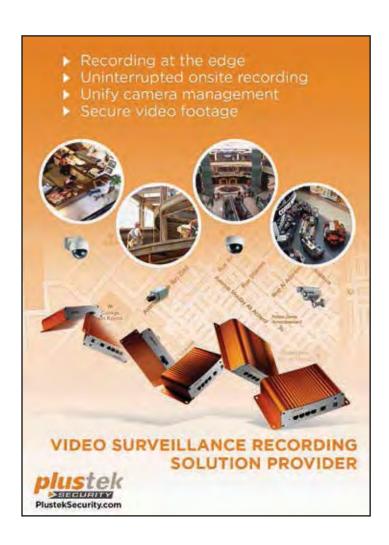
Many shareholders of S Corporations are unaware of this rule and chose to simply pay taxes on the net income of the corporation. In doing so, a shareholder may be avoiding the proper withholding and payment of payroll taxes. This is a hot topic with the IRS. This is especially true for closely held S Corporations, especially those with one or two stockholders.

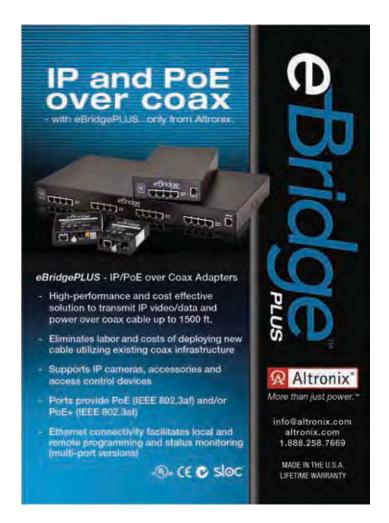
The IRS has audited several S Corporations in the past few years and assessed taxes and penalties against stock holders of these entities. It is important to note that the IRS has taken the position that the stockholders must take reasonable compensation from the Corporation. If you are an owner/employee of an S Corporation, you should discuss your compensation (or lack of it) for 2013 with your tax practitioner to determine that it is reasonable.

Some owners of closely held S Corporations try to "disguise" distributions as loan repayments. You should note that the taxpayers have the burden of proving that these were in fact loans. The Tax Court has found that four major factors are necessary to support the taxpayer's position that these were in fact loans. 1. There must be a written agreement to support the loan. 2. The shareholder should charge interest (and report the interest as income). 3. The Company should provide collateral for the loan. 4. There should be a fixed repayment schedule.

As I mentioned above, this is a hot topic for the IRS. Many taxpayers are unaware of the reasonable compensation requirements and may find out about this topic the hard way. Talk to your tax practitioner before year end so that you can make the proper corrections and pay the resulting payroll taxes now. Waiting until after year end, or worse, after an audit, may cause you to incur huge penalties and interest.

As communication changes from analog to digital telephone technologies, Oregon State Fire Marshal Mark Wallace issued an advisory to consumers to be sure these new technologies are compatible with their fire and sprinkler alarm systems. With new digital communication technology such as digital subscriber lines (DSL), voice over internet protocol (VoIP), and wireless, the signals may or may not be received correctly by an alarm monitoring station.

Any alarm signals that are missed or reproduced inaccurately may result in the alarm not being received or handled properly by the alarm monitoring system. "If your business or organization has already switched phone systems or is thinking about switching, I encourage you to contact your alarm company and confirm that the communication technology you want to switch to is compatible with your alarm system," says State Fire Marshal Mark Wallace.

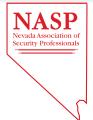

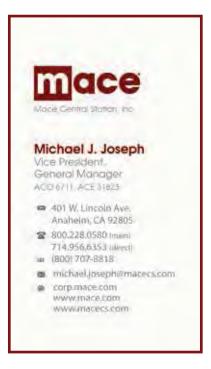

CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) established a zero-tolerance enforcement policy and now issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. 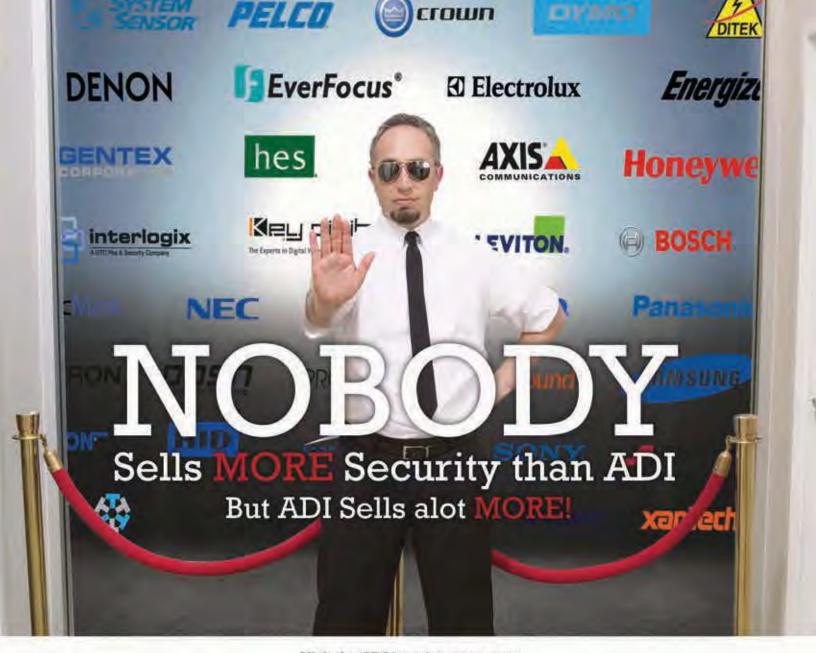
