### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I guess it is obvious that I am a big believer in the value of the work done by our local, state and national alarm industry associations.

Some of our most important work is promoting the partnership between our industry and police and fire agencies. The recent Public Safety Forum hosted by the Orange County Alarm Association (OCAA) and the Inland Empire Alarm Association (IEAA) is typical of the work being done in that area. Following is the text of my remarks at that event:

The public depends on the partnership between our industry and police and fire services everyday – Life safety systems in malls, shopping centers, offices, arenas, local, state and federal government buildings. Schools and universities. Fire alarms in homes and businesses. Surveillance and access systems in public and private areas. Airport, border and port security. Residential and commercial intrusion alarms, etc.

And what about the latest urgency: protecting our children in schools? Any effective solution to this critical problem certainly involves a partnership between electronic security systems and police and fire agencies.

Really, the partnership goes even further than the public. Which jail or police facility can operate without electronic surveillance, intrusion and access control systems? I know my company protects several police stations, and there are other people in this room who are doing similar work. William Berger, the United States Marshal from central Florida, who is responsible for protecting all the federal courts and judges in his area, told me that his job would not be possible without our industry's help.

So, I think the importance of working together is evident. I applaud all of you for being here. It takes a lot of work to put on an event like this, and a real commitment to attend.

Our industry associations promote professionalism and good citizenship with organizations like the Security Industry Alarm Coalition, Alarm Industry Research and Education Foundation, California Automatic Fire Alarm Association, Security Industry Association, Central Station Alarm Association, the Electronic Security Association, and all of our local and state associations. We train our members through accredited training programs like WBFAA and NTS. And we work with and support police, fire and regulation agencies like groups like California Peace Officers' Association, International Association of Chiefs of Police and the California Bureau of Security and Investigative Services.

And last, but certainly not least, FARA, whose president is our keynote speaker today. FARA is a national organization committed to reducing unwanted alarm dispatches.

There are differing opinions on the effect of unwanted alarms, and I won't get into that debate today, but there is no disputing the fact that: through a diligent internal effort, and by working effectively with municipalities and public safety agencies, the industry has greatly reduced the number of dispatches, and the impact of unwanted alarms on police and fire resources.

And I also believe that this that this attention has been so effective that there can be no question about the net positive effect of alarm systems in our communities.

I want to express my appreciation to OCAA, IEAA, all the people who worked so hard to put on this event, to FARA and keynote speaker, Kerri McDonald, and to all the representatives of our industry and police and fire departments who attended.

### The Successful Mentor

I am an enthusiastic believer in the power of mentoring and the positive results it produces for the salesperson and subsequently for their company. The successful mentor will strengthen the salesperson's conviction that they can do what they believe they can do.

Mentoring can, and should be, very rewarding to both the salesperson and the mentor. Having been the recipient of some wonderful mentors and more recently being a mentor to others, I can say without hesitation that the success that is achieved is celebrated by all.

#### **CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance**

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) established a zerotolerance enforcement policy and now issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is

required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. Learn more about electrician certification by visiting the Division of Apprenticeship Standards website. http://www.dir.ca.gov/DAS/ElectricalTrade.htm







## David Koenig Earns Prestigious Weinstock Award






