

The Buying Decision Process

One of the most controversial concerns confronting the salesperson is to identify how the prospect is going to make their buying decision. It is because of this subconscious concern being harbored by the salesperson that all too often they fail to recognize how the real decision making is processed. Much to the chagrin of the salesperson, prospects do not always make their buying decisions the way the salesperson

believes they do. Couple this with the fact that more often than not what the prospect is telling you is merely what they want you to hear and not what is actually acting as the basis prompting their decision. Regardless of what you are selling, and to whom you are selling, prospects will almost always make their purchasing choice employing the same decision criteria. The salesperson's challenge is to first understand this process and how the prospect reaches their decision to purchase, or arrives at another decision which may be to go to a competitor or not purchase at all. When the salesperson understands

this thought process, they will then be in the enviable position of directly addressing the prospect's decision process criteria and begin to enjoy a boost in their sales success. So, let's take a look at two of the critical criteria that have a direct influence on the prospect's purchasing decision.

The first critical criteria the salesperson must recognize is that the prospect will almost always lead with their personal or emotional reasons for wanting to learn more about why they should consider your product or service. Here the prospect has to very quickly identify with the benefit and/or value of what they are hearing to them. Their decision to purchase will not be satisfied unless they begin with their recognition of what the product or service can do for them. The salesperson must deliver this decision-influencing statement in their initial comments, or in the first paragraph if they are communicating via e-mail or printed matter. The prospect will not move to the second criteria unless they have satisfied this personal or emotional temptation which has been said so often as "what's in it for me."

Once the prospect has satisfied their personal or emotional temptation, they now have to recognize how they will employ this product

This is the second critical criteria of what you might refer to as the one-two punch. The prospect now has to validate their personal reasons with facts. What will the results of these benefits be to my business or to me personally? How will it increase my sales? How will it secure my facilities? How will it reduce my overhead? These are just some of the questions that your product or service must answer for the prospect. You can probably add some of your own depending on the product or service you are selling.

It is at this juncture that you focus on the product or service details that identify with what you learned are the needs of the prospect, and specifically answer these questions. Provide them with the fact-based justification to support what you have initially introduced as the benefits and value of your product or service to them.

Once you have united these two critical criteria, first by engaging them personally or emotionally to identify with the benefit or value to them, and then next by having them recognize how these benefits and value will be achieved, you have presented the prospect with the critical criteria for their decision-making process, moving them forward towards the decision to purchase from you.

You have significantly increased the probability that they will say ves when you ask for the order.







This protocol was founded through the joint partnership of APCO (Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials), CSAA (Central Station Alarm Association), and NLets (Interstate Justice and Public Safety Network System). PSAP is the call center responsible for processing requests for emergency responding agencies (police,

fire, ambulance, and other). The protocol reduces the two-to-three minute relay currently in place by allowing a computer at the dispatch center to process data. ASAP is a public-private partnership designed to eliminate telephone calls from alarm companies, eliminate miscommunications by alarm company operators and 9-1-1 PSAP call-takers, and reduce 9-1-1 processing time by two-to-three minutes or more. The reduction in 9-1-1 processing time has the potential for an equivalent reduction in response times by public safety first responders, resulting in a likelihood of increased law enforcement apprehensions made, fires extinguished more quickly and lives saved. ARIZONA LICENSING

Beginning May 1, 2013, the state Board of Technical Registration will issue certificates (licenses) to alarm businesses and agents who satisfactorily pass a criminal background check. As of October 1, 2013, a person shall not operate an alarm business unless they receive a certificate from the Board. Cities will no longer be able to require city licensure of companies and agents. For a copy of the bill, go to azleg.gov under "Bills" go to "Bill Info" then the bill number. AzAA will be sending out more information on this bill soon.



CERTIFICATION – FIRE/LIFE SAFETY TECHNICIAN - RENEWAL

For Fire/Life Safety Technicians with 4,000 hours of work experience, the state law requires them to be certified by passing the state exam. The renewal application is posted at www.dir.ca.gov/das and the state does not send out reminders. CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) established a zero-tolerance enforcement policy and now issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations
