

Move the "GateKeeper" Over to Your Side

Some of the most frustrating times for salespeople occur during their cold calling lead generation activities. Getting past the "gatekeeper" all too often becomes a monumental challenge. However, these people have been there forever, are there today and will be there tomorrow. So, understanding what their task is, and why, is critical for the salesperson to have a successful cold calling program. As we move forward our focus will

be primarily on cold calling. Understand though, that much of the content in this article can also be applied to telemarketing.


Let's begin by recognizing the gatekeeper's responsibility. They are there to act as a buffer between their management personnel and the myriad of vendors and representatives that call on them daily. One of the most common cries in our business community today is "I'm too busy". Quite often this is not just an excuse but a reality so the gatekeeper is charged with the responsibility to identify what would be of value to their company to grant entrance to the caller.



This, of course, presents a problem since all too often the gatekeeper is not thoroughly familiar with the intricate operational details of their business to make the decision on what would be a call worthy of passing through to management. Here is where the salesperson, in their very first few minutes with the gatekeeper, must help them make that decision and move the gatekeeper over to their side. The operative here is to have them immediately identify with a benefit and/or value to their company. It does not have to be detailed nor should it be technical. It must resonate with the gatekeeper as something that might be of interest and value to management. So, where do you begin?

Your very first rule of thumb is to remember politeness. As you introduce yourself exercise courtesy and politeness employing a pleasant body language coupled with a soft caring tone in your voice. Even if the gatekeeper is abrupt and sometimes even rude, very politely acknowledge recognizing their negative response and immediately follow with a powerful benefit that should resonate positively with the gatekeeper. Persistence coupled with politeness will prevail more often than you might expect.

Let them know you want to work with them and not around them. Even though they may be fairly low on the management scale, such as a receptionist, they like to feel important. Make them realize that you understand that you are not going anywhere without them. You should also let them know that you understand that they are just doing their job and you can truly appreciate that effort. Remind them again of another benefit of your product or service to their company and that their manager, owner or CEO would definitely want to learn more about how they can take advantage of the benefits of this product or service.

A very typical response from the gatekeeper might be "we already have a vendor for that product or service". Since you know that this could very well be their response and ultimately close the door for you, don't wait for that response. Bring it up first. You might say something like this. "You may already have a vendor providing this product or service and I understand that. However, (add another benefit here) we want your management to know about us so if something should change and you decide to bring in another vendor management will remember who we are". At that point ask for a meeting with the manager, owner or CEO.

Don't be surprised at how often you will get past the gatekeeper by exercising understanding, presenting benefits, being personal and doing it in a polite and persistence manner.







Currently, Simpson and Jensby are finishing their final phase of testing with Tempe Arizona and



will be able to communicate with them using the CAD (Computer Aid Dispatch) process by the end of the month. "ASAP" is the next generation for the processing of information from alarm monitor-

The Alarm Technician and Alarm Reduction

By Ron Walters

s an installation or service technician it is highly likely that YOU WILL PROVIDE THE ONLY INSTRUCTION to an alarm owner they will ever receive. This brief overview will help you in your mission to train your customers properly.

When you arrive at the job site introduce yourself and explain what your work will entail. Ask the customer to walk with you around the home so you will be able to point out any problems such as furniture that needs to be moved or fragile items that need to be secured. Then make certain that you put the customer on notice that you cannot make the alarm system operational until they have had training and inform them how long the training will take and on what day it will happen. All too often we are left in a position where the homeowner insists on keeping the training brief, and where only one person receives the training. While you may not always be able to train everyone at one time this is one of the primary reasons that the problem exists, so stress the need to train everyone.

When the installation is complete and you are ready to commence training, walk them through the installation and show them every point of protection, the location of the alarm panel, the location of the power supply and confirm that the power supply is NOT on a switched circuit. This tour serves a dual purpose. It educates the customer and also allows you to show how well you've cleaned up and further allows you to insure that everything is completed.





When you arrive at the keypad explain to the customer in clear language; avoid terms like arm and disarm and opt for on and off. Abort should be cancel and shunt should be bypass. Have the instruction manual in your hand and point out the pages for the proper way to turn the alarm on and off. The most difficult thing for customers to grasp is the concept of delay. This can be further complicated when you throw in home and away features that automatically take away the entry delay and or interior protection.

"Customer arms in the home or stay mode not considering that other family members have yet to come home." This can be further complicated by panels that automatically arm in the home or stay mode if the entry door is not opened and closed. Worse yet, the customer arm's the system in the away mode (because they are leaving) while other members of the family are still in bed. When they wake up they will trip any interior protection.

Explain in detail the process your company uses when the alarm accidentally goes off. Drill the pass-code or pass-word into them and insist that they choose something they will always remember. Remember that if you've done your job well it may be months before they actually make a mistake and need to cancel an alarm. It is critical to inform them never to leave the home after the alarm is triggered until they have spoken to the monitoring station. PRO-VIDE EVERY CUSTOMER WITH WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS AND THE MONITORING STATION PHONE NUMBERS. Have them tape those instructions inside a nearby by closet.

When you are completing the emergency call list use cellular numbers immediately after the premise number and never list a person who does not have a key and knowledge on how to use the alarm. Explain two-call verification, also know as ECV. If your company doesn't use ECV you should work to change that. If you have questions about ECV visit, <u>www.siacinc.org</u> where you will find information on this and many other issues.

Finally, if the alarm site is in a jurisdiction that has an alarm ordinance you should provide them with a copy of the key provisions of the ordinance. Things like fines for false dispatches, required registrations and renewals should also be covered in detail. Even if you are not required to, it is highly recommended that you provide each customer with a copy of the registration form and the key elements of the ordinance. While many companies consider covering these issues as a negative, almost all alarm ordinances require that YOU cover this material with the customer.

As the primary point of contact with the alarm owner YOU are both the critical and the weak link in the fight to reduce unnecessary dispatches. So the challenge has been made, become part of the solution and not part of the problem.



ARIZONA LICENSING

Beginning May 1, 2013, the state Board of Technical Registration will issue certificates (licenses) to alarm businesses and agents who satisfactorily pass a criminal background check. As of October 1, 2013, a person shall not operate an alarm business unless they receive a certificate from the Board. Cities will no longer be able to require city licensure of companies and agents. CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) established a zerotolerance enforcement policy and now issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. 




