

Errors and Omissions Insurance – The Why and What

Like all businesses, alarm and other security companies need specifically tailored types of insurance. One of the most misunderstood, yet most critical, is errors and omissions insurance (E&O).

Also called "professional liability" or "malpractice," E&O insurance is needed

by any person or organization that may be seen to provide professional services which includes typically a component of consultation or design. A business is also seen to be providing professional services if there is a requirement on that business to be licensed, or if the profession requires substantial knowledge or education beyond the ordinary person. In other words, almost all aspects of security design, sales, installation, integration and monitoring can be considered professional services.

E&O coverage protects against claims or lawsuits for mistakes or omissions that result in financial losses to a client or third party. The insurance is not the same as general liability insurance which protects against bodily injury and property damage as a result of an

accident --- but it is complementary to and should be combined with general liability insurance. The preferred method of combination is when both the general liability and E&O are written by the same carrier and

provided on the same "occurrence" trigger basis. Many insurers offer inferior claimsmade E&O coverage which provides only limited time to make a claim.

Unfortunately, financial losses to a client or a third party as a result of an alleged mistake or error can be unlimited.

The judgment can far exceed the value of actual replacement cost of property or medical expenses incurred by claimants under general liability. A loss of current and future profits, goodwill, loss of value to something intangible (like a businesses' reputation) are difficult to measure, and E&O losses tend to involve these type of subjects. Additionally, attorney's fees to defend an E&O claim are typically far greater than those incurred in property damage or most bodily injury claims.

Networking events are usually populated by individuals who have the extraordinary skill of making contacts and developing strong relationships with everyone at the event. These are the individuals who not only rep-



Rule number one at networking events, of course after being appropriately attired, is where you sit, stand or dine during the event. The natural preference of most people is to find friends or acquaintances for that comfortable feeling. Your performance and the way you reach out in these first few seconds sends





a message regarding the type of individual you are and the level of "action" they can expect from you.

Likewise, do not make the mistake of prejudging or making assumptions about others until you have the opportunity to speak with them. In networking it is critical to give the other person a chance to tell you about themselves before you make judgment as to their value to you. A few minutes of listening can make a significant difference from your first impression.

As previously stated, networking events are a powerful source for generating leads. There are probably dozens or more events in your market area so make sure you attend those that share your interest, and focus on the activities that will best serve you. Check their membership on their website and even go as a guest to one or two events before you make your decision to participate on a regular basis. Important to remember is that this is not a one time or short term program. Successful results may not be realized immediately; however, in time you will benefit from these events.

Beginning May 1, 2013, the state Board of Technical Registration will issue certificates (licenses) to alarm businesses and agents who satisfactorily pass a criminal background check. As of October 1, 2013, a person shall not operate an alarm business unless they receive a certificate from the Board. Cities will no longer be able to require city licensure of companies and agents. CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) established a zero-tolerance enforcement policy and now issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. 




