Life Safety Benefits to Adopting the 2012 IFC and IBC

There are several noteworthy changes to the 2012 edition of the International Fire Code (IFC) and International Building Code (IBC) that will enhance public life safety. These codes protect the public by incorporating the latest advancements in

technology and techniques. They are updated every three years to align with the new technologies and techniques.

Schools: In recent years there has been an increase in acts of violence committed against students and staff in kindergarten through grade 12 schools. Fire alarm systems installed in newly constructed schools will be required to utilize an emergency voice/alarm communication (EVAC) system for occupant notification instead of using horns that produce an audible tone. Using an EVAC system for the occupant notification system has several benefits over an audible tone.

Improved Communications: An EVAC system is able to provide pre-recorded and live voice instructions throughout the schools during emergencies whereas horns are only capable of providing an audible tone.

Reduced Costs: An EVAC system is capable of being used for fire alarm evacuation and other signaling purposes such as general paging, daily class changes, severe weather alerts, and acts of violence thereby reducing installations costs by eliminating the need for a separate public address system.

Improved Reliability: Public address systems do not have secondary power supplies and they typically do not monitor the integrity (supervise) of the power supplies, circuit wiring. Whereas EVAC systems are required to have a secondary power supply and supervise all critical system functions for opens, shorts and grounds.

Lodging and Healthcare: According to a U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) report more than 400 people die every year in the U.S. from accidental carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning and over 20,000 individuals are injured

due to CO poisoning each year. In recent years there have be numerous deaths occurring in hotels and motels. One of the most effective ways to reduce the incidence of CO poisoning is to ensure that CO detection devices are installed in places where people live, work, sleep, and study. To reduce CO Poisonings, newly constructed hotels, apartment buildings, dormitories, nursing homes and hospitals are now required to install CO detectors or CO alarms. The new IFC/IBC requirements are consistent with the requirements in the 2009 edition of the International Residential Code (IRC) for CO detection to be installed in all newly constructed one- and two-family dwellings.



Communicate to Succeed

The sales process is comprised of many critical steps that must be identified, perfected and practiced to achieve sales success. These critical steps have been identified and tools to perfect them have been provided in the many articles I have written in the past twenty plus years. This month I want to focus on the common denominator of all of these steps. Communication! Yes, the art or skill of communicating effectively to achieve sales success. The exhibition of true







professionalism is displayed in the way you communicate. The characteristics of communication play a significant role as you progress through the steps to sales success. The following paragraphs will take a look at a few of these critical steps and the important role of communicating effectively.

After your initial contact with a prospect, usually when trying to make that all important appointment, it is crucial that how you begin your introduction to that person - who has never in the past spoken to you- will determine if they will want to hear more from you. Here is where communicating the correct message with the appropriate tone of voice is so important. Think about it this way. To hear the second part of your message, the prospect must resonate positively with the first words you deliver. People respond positively to "what's in it for me." Begin your comments, after introducing yourself, with a benefit or two that the prospect will realize from your product or service. Once the prospect responds in the affirmative, you then ask for the appointment to explain how these benefits will be achieved.

E-mails can be, and should be, an effective way to communicate important information. All too often E-mails fall into one of the following two categories.

First, even though the recipient of your E-mail can reply, personal contact is quite often necessary. Make sure your contact information is easily located and easy to identify in the E-mail.


Secondly, keep your E-mails short and to the point. E-mails that are unnecessarily lengthy will quite often lose the interest of the recipient, and the important message you want delivered never gets to your target. Wherever possible, begin your E-mail with the most important part of your message so the reader will want to read on to learn more about the subject of your E-mail.

Be responsive. There are few reasons, if any, why you don't respond to an E-mail or phone call. Let's discount one of those reasons immediately, and that is our displeasure with telemarketers. However, what I have seen and experienced in the business world in the last several years has nothing to do with telemarketers. Too many salespeople do not respond in a timely manner, or do not respond at all, to an E-mail or phone call. So often the excuse is "I'm too busy." That is clearly a lack of organizational and management skills, and not only a case of rudeness but a lack of communication skills. Every communication should be considered for a response with a sense of urgency. It should not be difficult to plan your day or your week to allot a certain amount of time to respond in a timely manner to E-mails and phone messages.

Here is something to remember. Potential sales can be lost because of the lack of a timely response, while new business can be closed with more timely responses.

Think of effective communication as the lifeline to your business success. If you maintain that lifeline, then strong and healthy success is on the horizon. If you allow that lifeline to weaken or break, then success is clearly an uncertainty.



Dormitories: According a 2011 National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) report U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated annual average of 3,840 structure fires in dormitories, fraternities and sororities in 2005-2009. These fires caused an annual average of 3 civilian deaths and 38 civilian fire injuries. To reduce property damage and civilian casualties an automatic smoke detection system will be required to be installed in common spaces outside of dwelling/sleeping units of college and university buildings.

Improved Waking Effectiveness for High Risk Segments of the Population: Most fire alarm horns and integral sounders in smoke alarms/detector produce an audible tone in the 3 KHz frequency range. Findings from numerous research studies have concluded the 3 KHz audible signal is not as effective at waking up high risk segments of the population, such as people who are hard of hearing, school age children and the elderly, as a low frequency 520 Hz tone. To improve the waking effectiveness for high risk segments of the population fire alarm systems are required to produce the low frequency audible alarm signal in all sleeping areas to wake up people sleeping. Several examples are hotel and dormitory sleeping rooms as well as dwelling unit bedrooms within apartment buildings.

It is essential jurisdictions adopt the 2012 model fire and building codes as the consequential changes will have on public life safety are substantial.



Legislative News

The 2015-2016 Legislative Session and the November 2016 ballot will likely see major debates on tax policy. California's revenue stream is notoriously volatile. This is due, at least in part, to the fact that California has relied increasingly on income taxes over sales and property taxes. Therefore, California's tax rolls have become increasingly dependent on taxes assessed to the highest earners whose income is also volatile. This trend, in conjunction with a tendency to spend at the high-water mark for revenue, has landed the state in hot financial waters on more than one occasion.

Most recently, the Great Recession of 2008 punched a hole in the state budget in the magnitude of tens of billions of dollars. At the beginning of Governor Brown's third term in 2011, the state was facing a persistent \$26 billion deficit. Governor Brown spent his first two years back in office focusing intensely on finding a way to get a tax increase on the ballot, and approved by voters. That effort culminated in Proposition 30 (Prop 30) which increased the sales tax by a quarter cent for four years and increased the personal income tax for only the highest income earners through 2018. To bolster the measures chances at the ballot and to reduce the portion of the deficit which would not be eliminated by Prop 30's passage, Governor Brown championed billions of dollars in spending reductions in the Legislature. These spending cuts included reductions to the state's social welfare programs and higher education systems, realignment of criminal justice costs to the local level, and elimination of redevelopment agencies.

Prop 30 has ultimately been a windfall for the state. While originally projected to result in a \$6 billion increase in revenue, the measure has routinely outpaced this projection by as much as \$2 billion as the state's economy improves. The expiration of these taxes and the specter of a future economic downturn loom however, and stakeholders and legislators are beginning to consider ways of replacing this revenue.

Prop 30 Extension

For proponents of higher taxes and revenues, one of the simplest solutions to the loss of Prop 30 revenues is to extend the tax increases. In late March, the Public Policy Institute of California (PPIC) released a survey which demonstrated that a slim majority (51%) of likely 2016 voters would support an extension of Prop 30. Historically, such slim margins in polls have spelled defeat for ballot measures. Arguably, however, the PPIC's findings – which are independent of any campaign messaging in support of an extension – indicate that voters may be well disposed to extend Prop 30 in 2016 if a robust well-funded campaign is working in support. A number of health and welfare advocates and unions – most notably the California Federation of Teachers – have indicated their interest in extending Prop 30.

Extension of Sales Tax to Services

As noted above, California has historically suffered from volatile revenue streams due to an over-reliance on personal income taxes. One oft-cited solution to this problem is the expansion of the sales tax to services which would broaden the tax base and arguably make revenues more stable.

This idea is the linchpin of a proposal being championed by Senator Bob Hertzberg. Senator Hertzberg is interested in a massive restructuring of the state tax system. Conceptually, his proposal would extend the sales tax to almost all services while lowering corporate and personal income taxes for a net revenue gain of \$10 billion. This revenue would be allocated as follows:

- \$3 billion for K-14 education
- \$2 billion for higher education
- \$3 billion for local governments
- \$2 billion for a new earned income tax credit

Senator Hertzberg introduced a vehicle for this proposal early in 2015. However, like all legislation to increase taxes, the bill would require a 2/3 vote – and by extension the support of at least some Republican legislators – in order to pass. This would be a tall order for what is ultimately a significant tax increase. As such, the bill (SB 8) has served more as a conversation starter for Senator Hertzberg who has expressed interest in teeing up his proposal for the 2016 ballot.

Split Roll Tax

As you know, in 1978 California voters approved Proposition 13 (Prop 13) which limited property taxes to 1% of full cash value for the property as shown on the 1975-1976 tax bill. More significantly, Prop 13 prevented the reassessment of property value until the property was purchased, constructed, or a change in ownership occurred. The net effect of Prop 13 has been a reduction in property taxes over time.

While promoted as a means of protecting residential homeowners from rapidly escalating property taxes, Prop 13 has also effectively insulated commercial property owners as well. Democrats and public employee unions have frequently bemoaned this fact and have mounted several efforts to create a "split roll" for property tax in California which would return commercial and industrial properties to a continuous reassessment of property value.

Efforts have been made in recent years to pass split roll measures through the Legislature and on the ballot. The proponents – teachers and public employee unions – have expressed their intent to move forward again with an initiative. In the meantime, a constitutional amendment (SCA 5) has been introduced in the Legislature which would create a split roll. The SCA would direct the additional tax increment from this change - \$6 to \$10 billion – to K-12 and community colleges. As is the case with Senator Hertzberg's service tax bill, SCA 5 faces the likely insurmountable hurdle of a 2/3 vote.

In the meantime, the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association – the original champions of Prop 13 – are promoting an initiative to strengthen Prop 13. In addition to the protections noted above, Prop 13 provided a \$7,000 property tax exemption which reduces the assessed value of property by \$7,000. The Howard Jarvis initiative would increase the exemption to \$32,000.

Special Sessions and Tax Increases

In enacting the annual state Budget in June, Governor Brown called two special sessions of the Legislature. The First Extraordinary Session relates to funding for transportation infrastructure. The state's main source of funding for road maintenance and repairs is the fuel excise tax which brings in roughly \$2.3 billion annually. As California's transportation sector has become more fuel efficient and gas prices fluctuate, revenue from the fuel excise tax has diminished, leaving \$5.7 billion in unfunded repairs to state transportation assets annually. In calling the special session, the Governor has asked the Legislature to develop a new funding source for maintenance and repairs.

While little work has been done yet, there are already some options on the table. One option has been an assessment on vehicle miles traveled in lieu of the fuel excise tax. While relatively untried, this proposal has the benefit of recapturing revenue which has been lost as the state becomes more fuel efficient. Republican legislators have

suggested that revenue associated with the expansion of the state's cap-and-trade program to the fuels sector should be redirected for this purpose. However, the legality of diverting cap-and-trade revenue for road maintenance and repair is dubious as cap-and-trade revenue must be used to reduce GHG emissions.

The Second Extraordinary Session relates to funding for the state's healthcare and developmental services program. The state has long relied on a Managed Care Organization (MCO) tax to increase federal participation in the state's Medi-Cal program, which reduces the general fund obligation to Medi-Cal by \$1.1 billion annually. However, the federal government recently invalidated the structure of the state's MCO tax. In calling the Second Extraordinary Session, Governor Brown is seeking a way to replace the invalidated MCO tax and any revenue that would otherwise be lost from its expiration. In addition, the Governor intends to use some of the revenue from the MCO tax to support court mandated payments to In Home Supportive Service workers. Meanwhile, legislative leadership is interested in increasing revenue from the MCO tax to reverse recession era spending cuts to Medi-Cal and developmental services. To comply with federal rules, a new MCO tax would have to apply broadly to all managed care health plans and could, as a consequence, lead to increased insurance premiums.

As with all taxes adopted by the Legislature, the special session measures would need a 2/3 vote to become law. This may prove to be a tall order given the opposition from managed health care plans. As noted above, if the MCO tax is not replaced, the General Fund will need to cover \$1.1 billion in lost federal funds and, coupled with the expiration of the Prop 30 tax increases, would expose the tenuous nature of the existing General Fund surplus.

Conclusion

The Legislature is adjourned for its summer break until August 17. Upon return, we expect the managed care tax and the various transportation taxes to receive a lot of attention and possible action. It is too early to predict the outcome for either special session. However, given the fact that many businesses and some Republicans support dedicated funding for transportation, it is conceivable that the Legislature itself could adopt a transportation-related tax increase and leave all the other potential tax increases to be decided at the ballot box.

ESA Leadership Summit

CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. 


