

# **Getting to the Buying Signals**

Sales professionals are taught early in their career the importance of getting as much information as possible about the prospect, their expectations and their needs. This information, necessary to uncover the buying signals, will of course come directly from the prospect, usually in response to a litany of open-ended questions. Properly planned and methodically employed, the sales professional can uncover a wealth of information to support their challenge to move the prospect closer to them, uncovering those buying signals and begin the identification of a solution to meet the prospect's expectations and needs.

The real challenge, which all too often is not

recognized by the salesperson, is to keep the prospect engaged and their attention focused on the salesperson as these questions are being presented. To ensure that the prospect is engaged and attentive there is another approach, used with very successful results, that the salesperson can employ. That approach simply stated is *fewer questions* and *more benefits*. The explanation to this approach is quite simple.

Many of the questions will require a simple one-word choice response from the prospect such as yes or no, few or many, high or low, etc. This example draws a clear picture as to the type of these questions and the replies that can be expected from the prospect.

Most sales professionals are well prepared to respond to either choice of reply from the prospect. For example, they are prepared with a positive statement including benefits to a *yes* reply and similarly to a *no* reply. So, the question now is why ask those type of questions when you are already prepared with the answers to either choice? Instead of asking the question,

deliver a proactive statement which includes the benefits to the prospect for either response.

Put another way, show the prospect that you are knowledgeable of what they may be requiring without having to ask. You can replace many of these choice type questions with a proactive, knowledgeable, benefit laden response. This sends a powerful message to the prospect that you are understanding what their needs might be and you are prepared to present solutions to address those needs. Once the prospect recognizes your understanding of their needs and concerns, experience shows that they will begin to ask secondary questions while freely delivering a wealth of additional information regarding their needs and concerns. So, fewer questions and more benefits will move the prospect and the salesperson closer to a working partnership. This is a major step in strengthening a relationship and moving a prospect over to your side.

Accepting the success of this type of opening discussion the salesperson will probably have enough information to move towards identifying a solution. Now the salesperson must recognize buying signals, from the secondary questions, indicating that the prospect may be ready to buy.

Here are a few examples of the secondary questions and comments raised by the prospect that should trigger a buying signal to the salesperson. Tell me about your warranty and how it will work for me. Can I contact some of your customers to hear what they have to say? Can you go through the details again, so I am sure that I completely understand everything? Can you meet my quantity requirements without any problem? Then there are the two most powerful buying signals: what is my price? and where do we go from here?

The salesperson's commitment currently is to listen very carefully to what the prospect is asking or saying. Once the prospect presents any of these buying signals, your next challenge is to convert them into a sale. The salesperson must recognize that the time has come to stop selling and ask for the order. Realistically, although you have satisfactorily responded to all their buying signals the prospect may still have some reservations. *Now is not the time to ask why*. Go back and repeat your responses to their buying signals. getting the prospect's verbal acknowledgement and agreement for each one. Do not move forward if there are any doubts and until you have that verbal acknowledgement and agreement. Once the prospect has verbally acknowledged and agreed to your responses to their buying signals it becomes more difficult for them to say no when asking for the order. *Now is the time to ask again for the order*.

# A Dealer Perspective — #9



By Tony Smith

When you install a security system for your customer, or they ask you to monitor one they have installed themselves (DIY)...are they really protected? Perhaps. Most residential security systems that are installed today (and over the past 5 or more years) are wireless. An alarm company "Protected by" sign will likely deter the burglary at that location and send the bad guys to another home without the intimidating sign. Perhaps it is now time to consider whether we really provide the protection the customer anticipates, or whether we are fooling ourselves as well as the customer.

The industry's market penetration has been about 25 % up to now. The growth of DIY, the Internet of Things (IoT), video access control, two-way audio, and other new tech sensors coming into the marketplace are expected to push penetration to the 50% range over the next few years.

We have learned (Forbes magazine, February 2016) that technology conscious burglars are able to penetrate (hack) almost any wireless alarm system and manipulate it as they please. Our industry has been fortunate, up to now, that these bad actors prefer to focus on unprotected homes. As market penetration grows so does the risk of high-tech burglary. Various market research suggests that by 2020 we will have 20-50 billion inter-connected sensors or devices in service. It seems likely that these new systems will become a new playground for sophisticated bad guys.

How do we solve this impending problem and protect our customers, and as we shall learn in a future issue, how do we protect our own business?

The magic word is encryption. Encryption has a dual role in each monitored system. The first is to protect the link from the home (control panel) to the central station. The second link is between the sensors and devices to the control panel.

Security panels are dedicated management computing devices designed by the manufacturer. The firmware may be designed to interface with sensors from only that manufacturer or a group of manufacturers. Unfortunately, there has been a push in recent years to develop "open architecture" systems, (using Linux or Android), which allows sensors to be attached to various manufacturer control panels, thus making these panels virtually unable to encrypt. A proprietary control panel gives the manufacturer the opportunity to provide encrypted communication to the central station via a VPN or Ethernet. Cellular can be an acceptable redundancy as these signals are carried on a network pipe once it reaches the cell tower.

Two-way encryption has been around a long time. It involves a return digital signal that verifies that the message was received. The initial signal is scrambled to prevent the digital signals from being decoded or mimicked. Native RF services such as Zigbee, Z-wave and Bluetooth communications should be encrypted with industry-standard schemes utilizing 128-bit (or 168-bit) keys. Each sensor in a system should have a unique encryption code which can be decoded, and acted upon, through the panel. Properly implemented, the sensors will speak to each other (if programmed to do so) and to the panel, thus providing a homogenous system for the customer.

In addition to encryption for each system, it is important to have authentication as well. Authentication is the determination of who a sensor or device is. This insures that the device is authorized to connect and access the panel or other devices. We want to prohibit access to the system directly from the internet

- 1. The panel should have a specific IP/URL address to which it connects at activation.
- 2. Using algorithms, the panel sets up each session with the cloud platform. This authentication will generate new encryption keys for the new session.
- 3. These new authentication keys for each session should be able to be done remotely.


If a system has the encryption and authentication features described, it will show a "not at this home" sign to anyone trying to enter via the internet. We are eager to physically protect each door and window of our customer's home, but if the bad guys can enter through the internet or otherwise remotely interact with the system, we have left the front door wide open.

As an added precaution, each of us should consider adding cyber-insurance to our liability and E&O policy. It is widely available and reasonably priced.



# **CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance**

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. 


