
Closing Does Not Have to Be Magical

To be successful in today's competitive market the sales professional must be proficient in closing. They must know how and when to close. Their success will not be solely dependent on finding prospects, to interest them or even to befriend them but more importantly to employ the skills to exercise the ability to close. So many sales are lost because the salesperson does not employ the skills to close at the right time. So, what is the right time? There is no one magical moment that will never again be

presented. There is something that salespeople have heard over again and that is "you are closing from your first contact with the prospect." However, there are many signals and actions that take place during your time with the prospect that are critical to an effective and successful close.

Here are just a few that every salesperson should recognize, strengthen and employ to successfully close more sales.

— Make sure you are talking to the right person. When making an appointment always request that any other individuals within the compa-





ny (commercial) or family (residential) be at the meeting. You can do this tactfully and without alienating the person making the appointment by indicating that others will invariably bring up issues that could have been easily overlooked. This not only shows your sincerity for a meaningful sales meeting but also can act as a path to minimizing or eliminating the objection "I have to discuss it with someone else."

- Focus your presentation on the benefits, not the features. People recognize value when they resonate positively with benefits. Remember that features support benefits, so spend your valuable selling time discussing the benefits of your product or service to the people representing your prospect. Once you are confident they are resonating positively with the benefits then you can bring in the features to explain how the benefits are delivered.
- You must get the prospect to agree, verbally and emphatically, with all of the benefits you have presented to them. A nod of the head or a muzzled grunt is not an agreement. They must say "yes, that is what I want" or "I like that" or some other very similar positive response. Agreeing in this manner to all of the benefits during your presentation makes it that much more difficult for them to disagree with themselves or to offer an objection when you close. Do not move forward unless you get those agreements.
- Stay focused on one point at a time. Don't jump around to different aspects of your product or service even if the prospect leads you in another direction. In a polite way indicate that you are getting to that issue or subject and stay where you believe is important at that time. Get the agreement and then move to the concern presented by the prospect. Jumping around will only lead to confusion. Settling one point of concern at a time will lead to a prospect moving over to your side.
- At some time, the prospect will offer some signal that in their mind they have made the decision to buy or they are very close to that decision. Salespeople may recognize this as the buying signal. This could be in the form of a facial expression, physical action or positive question. Even a question or comment viewed as an objection can be interpreted as a buying signal. Instead of just responding to the question or comment, turn it into a positive response reinforcing what you have already presented. Depending on what you are selling it is always helpful to ask for the order in the form of a summary of the solution they have already agreed to.

Finally, I want to repeat the words of motivational speaker Les Brown. "Closing is the logical conclusion to an effective presentation." So, perfect your presentation and practice what you have perfected because closing successfully does not have to be magical.

PUBLIC SAFETY NEWS FROM ARIZONA

Prescott Considers Increased Fees

Adjustments could be in store for Prescott's proposed security alarm registration ordinance according to The Daily Courrier. The proposal for a mandatory security-alarm registration raised some concerns among Prescott City Council members. Deputy Police Chief Amy Bonney led off the discussion by telling the council that a mandatory registration would improve safety for the police officers who respond to securityalarm calls. Currently, she said, "It really compromises our staff safety, because we don't know the type of calls we're going to." In 2011, the council implemented an ordinance that penalized owners for false alarms. While the first false alarm elicits a warning, the second instance comes with a \$100 fine, Bonney said. Over the years, the alarm ordinance has resulted in a significant drop in false-alarm calls – from 2,524 in 2011 to 1,089 in 2015. Bonney pointed out that recent budget adjustments had led to a cut in the staff position for the alarm program. As proposed by the police department, the ordinance would require annual registration of security alarms, with a \$10 fee.

Councilman Steve Blair pointed out that two officers must respond to each alarm call. If the calls are false alarms, he said, they take up time that officers could be spending on other matters. "They are tied up, probably for the better part of an hour, maybe two hours," he said of the officers responding to the false-alarm calls. Susan Brenton, executive director of the Arizona Alarm Association, added her support for the ordinance, noting that enhanced verification of security alarms has helped other communities to reduce alarm calls by 25 to 70 percent.

According to The Daily Courrier, several council members questioned the need for another registration, on top of the business-license program. "I have no problem with the fining for false alarms," Councilman Greg Lazzell said. But, he said, the new business-license program already will be cataloging businesses. Oberg asked Bonney to incorporate the council's suggestions into the ordinance before taking the matter back to the council for a vote. After the meeting, the mayor estimated that the ordinance would be back before the council by late-June.

CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB.
