The Making of the Utah Alarm Management Committee

Alarm Management Committees (AMC) connect alarm dealers in states with their respective chiefs of police so they can hopefully achieve a long-term bond, working together through common issues like adjusting the Model Ordinance to their specific needs to conform to state law. With that relationship usually comes trust and provides the communication vehicle necessary to substantially reduce the risk of a chief producing an onerous ordinance. In fact, once the chiefs adopt the jointly produced ordinance, they promote it, and can urge/persuade others to adopt it. Their buy-in usually prevents other chiefs from coming up with more restrictive versions.)

SIAC representative Steve Keefer began establishing a relationship with the Utah Chiefs of Police Association four years ago. Whether sponsoring their golf tournament at their annual conference or displaying SIAC educational information within



their exhibit hall, the relationship, slowly began to build.

Keefer was able to meet Washington City, Utah Police Chief Jim Keith at a bi-annual State Agency Chiefs of Police Conference (SACOP). Both Keith and Keefer represented their respective states at SACOP. At the time. Keefer was still a Chief of Police at the Sparks Police Department in Nevada and the relationship carried over when Steve joined SIAC in 2013.

They shared information afterwards, and although the information was welcomed, the desire to move to the next level wasn't quite there. Relationships take time to build.

Over the next few years and more time together, Keefer shared why an AMC is effective and important. Chief Jim Keith embraced the idea and arranged a meeting at the 2018 IACP Conference in Orlando, Florida.

SIAC's Glen Mowrey led the meeting, with Utah Chiefs of Police Association Executive Director Val Shupe; Chief Keith; and Keefer present. Mowrey did a fine job and peaked much interest with the possibility of forming the first AMC in the Western United States.

Keefer presented a proposal several months later which got finalized. The board approved adoption of the AMC and members were soon selected.

Three alarm industry professionals were selected: Clint Beecroft of Peak Alarm Company (also Utah ESA President); Brian Kirtley of Comcast and Arlen Kingston of AAA Security.

Three Chiefs of Police were selected: Chief Jim Keith of Washington City PD; Chief Carl Merino of Roy PD; and Public Safety Director Dan Benson of Brian Head PD.

The first meeting with all six members and SIAC's Steve Keefer was held on March 26 in St. George, UT, during the association's annual conference. The first meeting produced a general sense of excitement from participants, looking to provide the association with valuable future resources for all aspects of alarm management.

It's a long process. But huge results follow as chiefs and alarm industry members buy-in to collective solutions. We recognize at SIAC that positive change takes time. We commit to working together to develop these committees, serving as a resource, providing counsel and guidance. Their growth and success is demonstrated by the numbers. We now have active AMC's in TN, FL, GA, MI, SC, NC, MN, CT, ME, TX, WV, PA, IL and now UT. The next Utah meeting is tentatively set for July in the Town of Brian Head, Utah.

Dear Membership,

The ISC West Show in Las Vegas is in full swing as I write this article -meeting with industry vendors, checking out the latest security offerings and
rubbing elbows with all of you. The array of products catering to the many
segments of our market is staggering.

Fire business as we know can have a more challenging degree of complexity over security. The California Alarm Association has long been seen as a trade association for firms that install electronic security systems. However, a large percentage of our members are also in the fire alarm business, to the point that twenty years ago, the CAA joined forces with the California Automatic Fire Alarm Association (CAFAA) to form the Western Burglar and Fire Alarm Association Unilateral Apprenticeship Training Committee to respond to the California requirement for the certification of Fire Life Safety Technicians.

Unlike intrusion detection, video surveillance and access control, fire alarm systems must go through a permitting and approval process before and after they have been installed. During this process, the installing company is working with an individual or agency referred to as the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ).

The job of the AHJ is to make a determination if the design of a fire alarm system is properly applying the relevant codes and standards and that the completed installation has followed the approved plans and was installed in accordance with the installation standards. Depending upon the jurisdiction, there may be more than one AHJ, as there may be a building, electrical, elevator, fire and mechanical inspector involved.

If you are a contractor that installs fire alarm systems, consider taking the time to get to know your AHJs. Most jurisdictions have published guidelines on the local requirements for a fire alarm system and the submitted shop drawings. Find out if they have any local or regional meetings that you could possibly attend. For fire alarm systems there is both the Southern and Northern California Fire Prevention Officers Association. Fire alarm contractors may become associate members. It is far easier to resolve issues with the AHJ when you have met them outside of attempting to get a project through.

So, as I'm wrapping up at the ISC, I look forward to seeing you all in May at the CAA Palm Springs Convention.

ANSI/TMA CS-V-01 Open for Industry Review

The Monitoring Association [TMA] opened a 60-day review and comment period for its ANSI/TMA CS-V-01 2019. This standard, Alarm Confirmation, Verification and Notification Procedures, defines methods by which false notifications for signals received from security systems can be greatly reduced. It was prepared under the direction of the Security Industry Standards Council (SISC) members with the participation of The Monitoring Association (TMA) members, Security Industry Association (SIA) members, Electronic Security Association (ESA) members, ASIS members and the Canadian Alarm Association (CANASA) members. TMA is an internationally-recognized non-profit trade association whose mission is to advance the professional monitoring industry through education, advocacy, standards, and public safety relationships.

This standard takes confirmation to its next level by defining multiple attempt confirmation, biometric, audio and video confirmation. Additionally, beyond the use of confirmation in standard or basic security systems, this document defines methods by which it can be determined an unauthorized activity is in progress and cannot be identified, thus false notifications can be greatly reduced. Various states and local units of government have adopted this standard, recognizing the lifesaving benefits monitored security and fire alarm systems provide.



A Dealer's Perspective — #13

Does your router deserve a break once in a while? You bet it does! Our lives are totally different now that we have the internet. However you use the internet – to pay bills, or to connect on social media – it is a crucial staple in households and businesses. Just as you shut down the computer to improve its operation, rebooting your router can improve its performance. According to Consumer Reports, the benefits of rebooting are twofold. If you want a faster connection, you should regularly turn your router on and off. Did

you know that your ISP (internet service provider) assigns a temporary IP address to each of your devices, which can change at any time? If your router is not rebooted, it may not catch the change and your connection may become quite slow. Rob Rohrman, head of IT at CompTIA confirmed that: "In general, it's a great idea to reboot the main internet router every couple of months. A router reboot can fix certain internet connectivity issues, from no internet connectivity to slow wireless connections, and should be one of your troubleshooting steps in a home or consumer environment. It is good security practice to reboot the router, your computer, and to change your password every month or two."

Restarting your router is more than just an aid to a speedier connection; it is--very importantly – a way to prevent yourself from being hacked. Last year, (PSA I-052518) the FBI recommended that all home and small business routers be rebooted after foreign hackers compromised thousands of networks worldwide. They were caught using a malware called VPNFilter, whereby the hackers were able to collect information, exploiting the device and blocking network traffic, thus rendering the routers inoperable.

The cybersecurity signs that you should be aware of because they signal that you may be in imminent danger of being hacked are:

- 1. You get contest information that you didn't sign up for.
- 2. You received a suspicious email and/or phone call.
- 3. You have the same password for everything (or most things).
- 4. You believe unbelievable deals.
- 5. You engage with suspicious emails.
- 6. You have a weak password.
- 7. You don't believe it could ever happen to you.
- 8. You never update your apps and Operating System.
- 9. You frequently leave your computer unguarded in a coffee shop.
- 10. You freely provided personal info to an unencrypted site.
- 11. You are too impatient to take proper care.
- 12. You do your banking by public Wi Fi.
- 13. You don't have a passcode on your phone.
- 14. You never back up your data.
- 15. You share too much information on social media.

Ask those around you if they think you exhibit any of the above traits and carefully analyze your habits to ensure you don't leave your "Digital Door" open. The message, for each of us, is to take charge of our digital devices and realize that they are magnets for bad guys and their malware.

Since I am speaking to fellow alarm dealers, think about how you run your business and the "Digital Doorway" into your office. Have you taken the precautions necessary to protect your data? The typical alarm dealer probably has more key information on his customer than he may realize, and the bad guys will soon figure that out if they haven't already. It seems to me that we need a service to offer our residential and small business clients that protects their network and end points along with the IoT devices that they install in the future. This would hopefully be software that would be downloaded to the customer's system and enable them to repel and reject the malware that is hanging around waiting for an opening. This species of software will not only protect the customer's "Digital Door", but would also create a loyalty, or sticky, factor that will protect against encroachment by DIY and other predatory entities.

CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB.
