

Follow Up Programs Will Close More Sales and Strengthen Customer Service

Salespeople learn very early in their career that the sales process consists of five critical steps. They are: the lead, the appointment, the presentation, the close and the follow up. During my career as a salesperson and sales executive and now as a consultant I've watched companies spend significant

dollars and time to develop leads, training their salespeople on how to make the appointment, put forth an exceptional presentation and employ effective closing techniques. Interestingly, so little time is devoted to the fifth and critical step in the sales process, the follow up. Although I refer to follow up as the fifth step in the sales process, the skill and necessity of an effective follow up plan really begins with the lead. So, let's start there.

Leads are the lifeline of a successful business. Your company invests financially in the development of leads through many media outlets as well as effective networking events. I have said this many times and as recently as last month's column: leads should be recognized as "someone who has made the decision to buy from me and now I have to prove to them they made the right decision." Without a plan to follow up a lead, you can be sure they will be left to your competitor. Unless specifically instructed otherwise, leads should always be followed up with a phone call. Unfortunately we live in a time when people just do not return phone calls. Call it rudeness or any other name you happen to like, but it is a reality. However, we cannot allow that to be a roadblock. You must have a multi-step plan for lead follow up. Your target for follow up is to get the appointment, and that will only be successful if the prospect immediately recognizes a benefit of your product or service to them.

Begin your first phone call by announcing your name, company and the fact that you are following up the lead. If you are talking

directly to the prospect, then your challenge is to get them to immediately want to hear more from you. Without hesitation, identify a specific benefit and value of your product or service to them. You may need to identify a second benefit or value if you do not get an immediate positive response. Once the benefit and/or value resonate with the prospect, they may ask a few questions. This is where you learn more about the prospect's needs and add additional benefits followed by asking for the appointment. If you are leaving a voice mail after identifying a benefit, thank them for the opportunity and let them know you will try again. You can leave your number for a return call but that puts the responsibility on them to call you, where it should be your responsibility to call them. You can call back very often, possibly every day, until you get a response. Now, the critical factor here is that you can be persistent leaving a different benefit each time; however this persistence must be coupled with politeness. For example you might start your message with something like this:

"I understand your time is very valuable and I certainly do not intend to abuse any of that time. If I could just have a minute or two I would be very appreciative." Remember, you are not talking about product or service features. Instead you are talking about the benefits of your product or service to the prospect. The features will come later

The second critical step where follow up has been poorly administered is with a new customer. In all fairness, many companies do have a follow up program with their sales or customer service personnel. The weakness that exists in many of these programs is when the follow up takes place. Depending on the product or service your customer has purchased, the follow up contact by phone should take place the same day or certainly within twenty four hours. You must understand this. There are only three reasons why a new customer will call you. The first is to compliment you (which unfortunately will not happen too often). The second is to ask a question regard-

ing your product or service, and the third is to register a complaint. Think about this. If a new customer has a question and does not get to ask about it right away, after a couple of days that question will invariably become a complaint. That is human nature and we have to deal with it.

To strengthen and deepen your relationship with your new customer while opening the opportunities for referrals, your follow up plan should be based on immediately, same day or next, contacting that new customer and making yourself available for any questions. It only takes a few minutes to accomplish this service but it takes a lot more time and investment to replace an unhappy customer.

Remember, follow up is one of the five critical steps to sales success. Develop your follow up plan, practice and employ it. Your rewards will be more valuable appointments and qualified referrals. Enhancing Public Safety Through Partnerships

Residents and businesses in our communities increasingly rely on alarm systems to protect their homes and places of business from crime and to provide a heightened sense of security for themselves and their families. With the growing availability of low cost alarm systems and the nationwide trend toward automated homes the number of alarmed sites in our cities and towns can be expected to increase even more in the years ahead. If not effectively managed that increase in alarm sites will generate even more alarm calls going to police dispatch centers. Alarm calls are already the leading dispatch call for police service in most communities. It is also no secret that most alarm calls are false. Needless calls place an expensive burden on police resources. That drain is particularly acute at this time when most departments are laboring under tight budgets and significant staffing shortages.

To better protect and manage their patrol, resources hundreds of jurisdictions across the country have moved to strengthen their alarm ordinances. Those ordinances clearly fix responsibilities on alarm users and alarm companies to work in concert with police departments to sharply curb the number of unnecessary dispatch requests.

Police Departments such as Charlotte-Mecklenburg, NC, Phoenix, AZ and Greenville, SC can point to a sustained record of success in dramatically reducing their alarm dispatches over a period of many years. While fifty to sixty percent reductions in the level of alarm dispatches is regularly achieved in communities with a high concentration of commercial alarms, the Marietta Police Department recently reported their alarm dispatches calls had declined over seventy-five percent since 2007, the year before they implemented their new ordinance.

In Connecticut, the Bridgeport Police Department has achieved and maintained a sixty-five percent reduction in alarm dispatches since implementing and strictly enforcing a new alarm ordinance in 2000. When compared to the level of alarm dispatches in 1999, Bridgeport's reduction in alarm dispatches equates to nine thousand fewer alarm dispatches being processed through the City's communications center each year.

In developing and implementing a plan to reduce needless police dispatches to alarms, it is essential to understand that the bulk of false alarm activations emanate from a small fraction of the alarm sites in a community. Statistics from several jurisdictions which monitor this issue very closely has repeatedly shown that eighty-five percent of the registered alarm sites will generate no alarm activations during the course of a year. Another eight to ten percent of those sites will account for one or two alarm activations. The alarm sites in this latter category show no pattern of repeated alarm activations from year to year.

The remaining five percent of the alarm sites generate three or more alarm dispatches per year. Those sites are the primary drivers of the false alarm problem and they display a pattern of generating a high number of alarm activations year after year. Accordingly, they contribute disproportionately to the unnecessary alarm requests submitted for police dispatch. The most problematic sites are often businesses which have a high staff turnover or are public buildings which do not effectively manage their alarm systems or regulate the movement of people in their facility. It is the chronic abusers in this five percent of alarm sites that must be the central focus of any serious effort to effectively reduce alarm dispatches.

CSLB Enforces Zero Tolerance

The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) issues legal action against any C-10 Electrical contractor who willfully employs an uncertified electrician to perform work as an electrician. CSLB is legally required to open an investigation and initiate disciplinary action against the contractor (which may include license suspension or revocation) within 60 days of receipt of a referral or complaint from the Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS). Labor Code Section 3099.2 stipulates that anyone who performs work as an electrician for C-10 Electrical contractors shall hold an electrical certification card issued by DAS; DAS is required by Labor Code Section 3099.2 to report violations to CSLB. 
